Footpaths and Bridleways

The Parish Council has allocated some funds this year to improving the footpaths and bridleways. We already deal with cutting back excess foliage (for Cornwall Council) but the signs also badly need attention and/or replacement, and we also aim to ensure the paths are clear of any blockages. The first task is to survey the paths to identify what needs doing. The Parish Council has installed a litter bin in the lay-by near Penpoll Farm, and dog waste bins by the cemetery in Quethiock and in Trehunist. These are well used.
